

Literacy

In Year Six, children's writing is assessed by the adults in the Year Six Team and those levels sent to the Department for Education (DfE).

Children have been working really hard to produce a wide variety of written evidence that clearly shows what level they are.

Types of writing this half-term include: myths (heroes, magical objects / powers, etc) and journalistic writing (eg newspaper reports).

Children will plan, draft, write, edit and improve their writing.

Revision

Children will at this stage, understand what they do well (their strengths) and understand what they still find tricky (their areas to improve). Lessons and booster sessions will focus on helping children to acquire the revision skills needed to address their gaps, in preparation for the SATs.

Maths

Children will look at co-ordinates and learn how to find missing points. They will use jottings and learn new strategies to pinpoint the needed information.

We will look at decimals numbers: Rounding, place value, finding the largest and smallest number and using calculations to find answers.

Science

Animals including humans

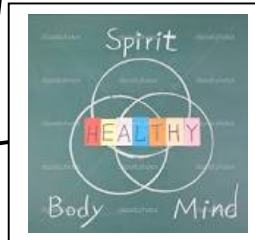
In this unit children will be learning to recognise the impact of:

- Diet
- Exercise
- Drugs
- Lifestyle on the way their bodies function

Grammar

Children will look at ways to extend their vocabulary and their understanding of word meanings, in order to prepare for the grammar test. There will be special Booster classes each week where children will face complex challenges and tasks.

Children will also spend considerable time improving their understanding of tricky spelling rules.



ICT

We will be using Maths Shed and Education City to revise.

Reading Comprehension

Children have developed a strong understanding of reading comprehension skills throughout the year and so this half-term focuses on the way children apply this understanding within SATs tests. Children need to show they can locate information quickly, find clues from a text to support their point of view and explain author's language choices.

History

Medicine

Children will be looking at the history of medicines. They will be looking at early history of medicine to describe some early theories of diseases and early medical treatments.

PE

Volleyball

Children will be developing their skills through games and sports. The main skills focused on are: movement to the ball, throwing and catching, serving, scoring and teamwork and co-
