

# PP and Non PP Improvement between start of 2013/14 and start of 2014/15 academic year

## Key Questions:

Can we demonstrate significant improvement in achievement over the last twelve months to show as a school we have the capacity to improve?

The following definitions have been used within this 'Progress' summary

- \* 'Higher' ability (Above / Well Above age-related expectations: 1+ APS)
- \* 'Middle' ability (Age-related / just below age-related expectations: equal to expected APS or 1-3 APS lower)
- \* 'Lower' ability (Well below age-related expectations: 4+ APS lower)
- \* 'SEN' – School SEN register
- \* 'Higher Middle Total' (ranges from 1+ APS to 3 APS lower than expected)

*NB: APS = Average Point Score.*

## Current Year Six

### CONTEXT

- There are currently 27 children in Year Six. (14 children in Class 6M and 13 children in Class 6I).
- 30% (8/27) boys and 70% (19/27) girls.
- 26% (7/27) Free School Meals
- 41% (11/27) receive Pupil Premium funding
- 22% (6/27) are SEN (2 Statements)
- **45% (5/11) of Pupil Premium children are SEN**
- **6% (1/16) of Non Pupil Premium children are SEN**
- 39% more PP children are SEN than Non PP children.
- 27% (3/11) of Pupil Premium children are boys.
- 73% (8/11) of Pupil Premium children are girls.
- 31% (5/16) of Non Pupil Premium children are boys.
- 69% (11/16) of Non Pupil Premium children are girls.

## CONTEXT

- There are currently 30 children in Year Five.
- 53% (16/30) boys and 47% (14/30) girls.
- 17% (5/30) Free School Meals
- 37% (11/30) receive Pupil Premium funding
- 20% (6/30) are SEN
- **36% (4/11) of Pupil Premium children are SEN**
- **11% (2/19) of Non Pupil Premium children are SEN**
- 25% more PP children are SEN than Non PP children.
- 45% (5/11) of Pupil Premium children are boys.
- 55% (6/11) of Pupil Premium children are girls.
- 58% (11/19) of Non Pupil Premium children are boys.
- 42% (8/19) of Non Pupil Premium children are girls.

- There are now 27% more PP children within the 'Higher ability' group.

- 23% (7/30) are SEN
- **36% (5/14) of Pupil Premium children are SEN**
- **13% (2/16) of Non Pupil Premium children are SEN**
- 23% more PP children are SEN than Non PP children.
- 36% (5/14) of Pupil Premium children are boys.
- 64% (9/14) of Pupil Premium children are girls.
- 50% (8/16) of Non Pupil Premium children are boys.
- 50% (8/16) of Non Pupil Premium children are girls.

- 31% (9/29) Free School Meals
- 41% (12/29) receive Pupil Premium funding
- 17% (5/29) are SEN
- 25% (3/12) of Pupil Premium children are SEN
- 12% (2/17) of Non Pupil Premium children are SEN
- 13% more PP children are SEN than Non PP children.
- 42% (5/12) of Pupil Premium children are boys.
- 58% (7/12) of Pupil Premium children are girls.
- 65% (11/17) of Non Pupil Premium children are boys.
- 35% (6/17) of Non Pupil Premium children are girls.

- There are now 17% more PP children within the 'Higher ability' group.
- There are now 22% more Non PP children within the 'Higher ability' group.

## Current Year Two

### CONTEXT

- There are currently 31 children in Year Two.
- **65% (20/31) boys** and 35% (11/31) girls.
- 23% (7/31) Free School Meals
- 23% (7/31) receive Pupil Premium funding
- **23% (7/31) are SEN**
- 29% (2/7) of Pupil Premium children are SEN
- 21% (5/24) of Non Pupil Premium children are SEN
- 8% more PP children are SEN than Non PP children.
- 43% (3/7) of Pupil Premium children are boys.
- 57% (4/7) of Pupil Premium children are girls.
- **71% (17/24) of Non Pupil Premium children are boys.**
- 29% (7/24) of Non Pupil Premium children are girls.

### PROGRESS IMPROVEMENTS *(September 2014 figures compared to September 2013 figures)*

#### Reading

- There are now 13% fewer PP children within the 'Higher or Middle ability' groups.
- There are now 23% fewer Non PP children within the 'Higher or Middle ability' groups.
- There are now 13% more PP children within the 'Lower ability' group.
- There are now 23% more Non PP children with the 'Lower ability' group.

#### Writing

- There are now 10% more PP children within the 'Higher or Middle ability' groups
- There are now 51% fewer Non PP children within the 'Higher or Middle ability' groups.
- There are now 10% fewer PP children within the 'Lower ability' group.
- There are now 45% more Non PP children with the 'Lower ability' group.

#### Maths

- There are now 14% fewer PP children within the 'Higher or Middle ability' groups
- There are now 9% fewer Non PP children within the 'Higher or Middle ability' groups.
- There are now 5% more PP children within the 'Lower ability' group.
- There are now 8% more Non PP children with the 'Lower ability' group.

## Summary of Key Issues to address 2014-15

### School Definitions:

‘Higher’ ability (Above / Well Above age-related expectations: 1+ APS)

‘Middle’ ability (Age-related / just below age-related expectations: equal to expected APS or 1-3 APS lower)

Increase the % of PP children in the Higher / Middle ability groups in Year Six Maths.

Increase the % of Non PP children in the Higher / Middle ability groups in Year Four Maths.

Increase the % of PP and Non PP children in the Higher / Middle ability groups in Year Two Reading.

Increase the % of Non PP children (mainly boys) in the Higher / Middle ability groups in Year Two Writing.

Increase the % of PP and Non PP children in the Higher / Middle ability groups in Year Two Maths.
